County Road 60 on the Coulter- Grand Lake Stage Road, under Shadow Mountain Reservoir, came from KaRose past the Anglers Club, etc.




General Ranch Information:


- * The Gores named the ranch Cold Springs Ranch, then Williams changed the name to Williams Ranch, then Jack Schilz changed it back to Cold Springs Ranch.
- * Jack Schilz bought the whole ranch just for the fishing, according to his step-granddaughter Maryan Pharo. Prior to this, it had been a working ranch. People used to sneak in through the gate to fish, and her grandfather Schilz would get on an old white horse, and "run 'em out". There was a natural spring, and water was piped into the house, and had gravity flow. Jack Schilz had fish ponds where he raised trout. An irrigation ditch crossed the ranch.
